Across the Province of Ontario more than 200 new cases of COVID-19 were confirmed on Tuesday, the most in a single day in nearly three weeks. The majority of these new cases were found in people 39 years old and younger and can be attributed to both a backlog of reporting and what some are calling quarantine fatigue.
